Declaration of Interest

No declarations of interest were noted.

1. Lanarkshire Campus

The Chair welcomed members to the meeting and provided an update of recent conversations he, along with the Principal, Depute Principal and Director of Strategic Planning & Development, had had with the two potential offsite developers. Further statements of support from the off-site developers were tabled at the meeting.

The Principal introduced discussion of this item by reminding members that the University's Corporate Strategy, approved 18 months ago, put students at the heart of all University activities. He encouraged members to consider the information

presented and take collective responsibility for determining the best option to deliver a fit for purpose, modern Lanarkshire Campus which would be affordable and sustainable for the future.

The Depute Principal made a presentation to Court, which built on earlier presentations made and, in particular, provided an update on the emerging qualitative and quantitative detail associated with the off-site delivery options under the options approval process.

Members confirmed that the options appraisal process adopted by the University, particularly the work of the Project Board and the Court Scrutiny Group had been robust and transparent, and they were content with the rigour and appropriateness of that process.

Court agreed that, based on the qualitative and economic analysis of the options identified that the two onsite options, namely the "do minimum" and the "Pixar" options should be disregarded.

After considerable and detailed discussion, and on the basis of the qualitative and economic assessment undertaken, Court agreed that the Eco Campus at Hamilton International Technology Park provided the best solution to meet the University's aspirations for a new state of the art, modern Campus in Lanarkshire and that a full business case should now be developed for consideration by Court in due course. It was noted that it was not until this point that formal agreement to proceed would be confirmed.

The SAUWS Depute President (Education & Welfare) advised that while the Students' Association was disappointed that Court was not minded to remain on the existing location, the second preference from the student body was the Eco Campus site.

The Chair thanked all members of the Project Board and the Court Scrutiny Group and members of Court for their input highlighting the benefit to the process of the individual, distinctive and practical experience of members in bringing the project forward to this stage.
