OUR FIRST STEPS TO NURSING MODULE IS A GREAT CHOICE IF YOU ARE DUE TO START OUR BSC ADULT NURSING OR BSC MENTAL HEALTH NURSING COURSES AT UNIVERSITY OF THE WEST OF SCOTLAND OR INTEND TO APPLY FOR THEM IN THE FUTURE.

About the course:

You will begin the course by choosing an appropriate health condition which interests you. Your topic provides the main theme that you will revisit throughout the module. Each week there will be a set of online tasks which have been designed to support your development in relation to finding evidence, academic writing, referencing and numeracy. During the module there will be the opportunity to come into university for one or two days to become familiar with the campus and our state-of-the-art teaching resources. This course will enable you to develop strategies to organise study time effectively, work to deadlines and familiarise yourself with UWS learning and assessment platforms. It is assessed through a graded essay which will require you to gather, evaluate and present information regarding your topic. This will be combined with a reflective statement discussing your experiences during the module.

Entry to our BSc Adult Nursing / BSc Mental Health Nursing programmes:

Upon successful completion, the First Steps to Nursing module is worth 20 credits at SCQF Level 7. It is recognised as equivalent to one SQA Higher at Grade B as part of an application for our BSc Adult Nursing/BSc Mental Health Nursing programmes.
