## **English Language Support 2019-20 Term One**

**English language modules** are credit-bearing. As with all modules at UWS, please note:

- attendance is required and recorded on Banner
- regular homework to be completed outwith weekly classes
- module performance is assessed
- result recorded on your UWS transcript

There are several options available to support your study:

## 20 credit (10 ECTS), start w/c 9th Sep and final enrolment is noon Fri 27th Sep

- Business English 3.1 (level 9, English with a focus on business, can be studied by non-business students)
- Advanced English (level 9, general English module)
- English for Academic Purposes (level 9, module designed to support students to improve their English to support their academic study)
- English Proficiency (level 10, general English for students who have a higher level of English)

## 10 credit (5 ECTS), start w/c 30<sup>th</sup> Sep and final enrolment is noon Fri 4<sup>th</sup> Oct - they are listed in italics in the table below

- Business English (level 9, English with a focus on business, can be studied by nonbusiness students)
- English for Academic Purposes (level 9, module designed to support students to improve their English to support their academic study)

To register for a module, students should complete the 'English Language Module Form', check the day/time of their programme modules and indicate **all availability** for studying English, returning to <a href="mailto:englishlanguage@uws.ac.uk">englishlanguage@uws.ac.uk</a> or to E319, Henry Buildings East, UWS Paisley as soon as possible and by the deadlines above.

Erasmus + exchange students are able to study one English language module at no cost as part of the agreement in term one only.

The School of Education offer a number of free spaces to non-EU students who are studying at UWS for a full academic year (or more) in term one only.
