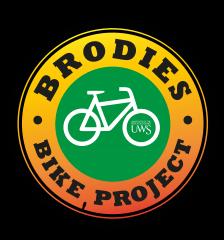

#### Being a Good Mate at UWS

At UWS, being a good mate goes both ways. Supporting others with kindness and respect—whether that's sharing notes, checking in, or just reducing isolation by including someone into your group-boosts their wellbeing and yours. Little actions create a stronger, happier campus community for all.

#### Listen & Check In

Ask, 'How are you?' – it might mean more than you think. Try to be a good listener. Give others space to talk without interrupting.

#### Offer Practical Help

Share notes if they've missed a class. Recommend study groups or academic support, if they are falling behind.

#### **Be Inclusive**

Invite others to join at breaks or student events. Help new or shy students feel part of the group.

#### Offer Encouragement

Remind them of their strengths and past achievements to get here. Suggest UWS student services if they're struggling.

#### **Respect Boundaries**

Being supportive doesn't mean you have to solve everything for others. Respect their space and privacy and protect your own.



#### Counselling & Wellbeing

The Counselling team wish to reassure you that we are here to support Resident students throughout your academic journey. At UWS our counselling model, means instead of signing up for a block of counselling sessions, you book your counselling appointments on a session-by-session basis. This model allows our service to be more accessible, have no waiting lists and we are available when you are ready to speak with us.

This appointment cannot influence any request for an appeal, resit, or visa extension.

Your issues do not have to be related to your studies, the service is confidential, staffed by professional counsellors and free to UWS students.

MYTH: You need kids or to be on benefits to get extra funding. FACT: Discretionary Funds are open to all eligible UK students. Check the criteria and apply TODAY!

MYTH: The <u>Funding & Advice</u> service is just for emergencies. **FACT**: We're here for you all year round - for Funds guidance, <u>budgeting</u>, a <u>change in direction</u>, <u>further study</u>, and more!

MYTH: You have to be in debt before you can ask for help.

**FACT**: Financial health is all about planning ahead. You might already have debts (separate to your student loan), or you might be OK for money just now but worried about managing as the year goes on - get in touch with Funding & Advice!

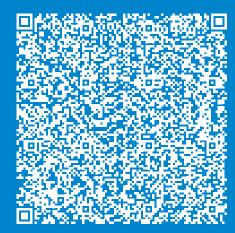

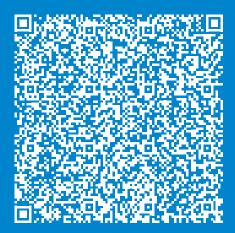

#### UWS Alumnus Announced New CEO of basketball scotland



Basketballscotland's Board has announced a University of the West of Scotland (UWS) graduate as its new Chief Executive Officer (CEO).

UWS BSc (Hons) sport development graduate David Fallon will be joining basketballscotland, the recognised National Governing Body for basketball in Scotland, from Scottish Athletics.

David commented: "I am absolutely delighted to be appointed to the Chief Executive Officer role at basketballscotland. Basketball is a sport that I enjoyed throughout school, and have experienced and supported in recent years as my nephews begin their journey at club level.

"I look forward to continuing the great work of Kevin Pringle and to working with the Board, staff, and partners to deliver on the vision, values, and strategy for basketball in Scotland.

"I am excited to start in late summer, and I look forward to meeting, and working

collaboratively with, those who are the foundation of the sport: our clubs, members, coaches, officials and volunteers."

A graduate from the Lanarkshire Campus in 2013, David gained experience working at the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games before joining Scottish Squash as a Regional Development Manager for the West of Scotland.

At Scottish Squash David went on to lead on programmes and initiatives to broaden the sport's appeal and has a passion for development, before joining scottishathletics in 2021 as head of development.

"My education at UWS has underpinned my whole career, and provided me with a solid foundation of knowledge and understanding to progress through my career in Scottish Sport," added David.

"I've also enjoyed staying engaged with the university to support academically with a several projects throughout my career, providing research and placement opportunities for other students."

#### Sporting Alumni Stories Captured in New Podcast Series

A podcast series featuring sporting alumni, produced by University of the West of Scotland (UWS) journalism/journalism (sports) students, has been released.

The Top of the Scots podcast series delves into the world of sport with episodes from some of the university's most talented former students, highlighting their incredible sporting successes across an array of sports.

The series came about as part of a module in the BA journalism/journalism (sports) degree programme at UWS, and features student interviews with an Olympian, Paralympians, Commonwealth athletes, Coaches and a Scottish Cup winner.

"I wanted to combine the knowledge of former students and their incredible graduate journeys with those in my current class about to set out on their own, to help them think there is a world beyond just the Old Firm when it comes to Scottish sport," said Dr James Mahon, journalism/sports journalism lecturer. "They have learned through theory and practice in this module and have something proud and tangible to show prospective employers."

Kicking the series off is an interview with Bellshill native and triple Olympian Kirsty Gilmour who has represented both Scotland and Great Britain in Badminton. UWS student Callum Lindsay learns about what it takes to deliver at the highest level in her sport and hears how her time at UWS helped her develop as an athlete.

Since 2016, Kirsty has won six silver and two bronze medals in European competition. She also won Commonwealth silver at Glasgow 2014, Commonwealth bronze in 2018, and represented Team GB three times at Rio, Tokyo and Paris.

Talking about the podcast series, Callum commented: "For me this was about communication and taking ownership of my episodes while helping the others with their recordings, we all want to tell the stories of those who have gone before and do them justice."

Working with the University's Fundraising and Alumni team, students researched the alumni, liaised and interviewed seven former students in person, online via zoom, even crossing time zones to speak to one alumnus in the US. Other alumni interviewed as part of the series included: Captain of Scotland's men's Cerebral Palsy Football team Matthew Wynne; Commonwealth Games and now professional boxer Stephen Newns Jnr; Scottish Cup winner and former professional football player David Winnie; Professional Scottish para table tennis player Martin Perry; Head Basketball Coach

in the US Neil Harrow; Boccia player and Gold Medal Paralympian Stephen McGuire MBE; and WWE Wrestler and WWE referee Thomas Kearins

A huge thank you to our sporting graduates for taking part in the series and to students Kyle Murphy, Callum Lindsay, Johnny Orr and Robbie Gray.
